While the formal aspect of the job is a matter of pride and has been hugely enjoyable, it is my contact with Herefordians from all aspects of life in the county which has been the most rewarding for me. I have been welcomed without exception wherever I have visited.

We have been very fortunate in the number of Royal visits to the county, which have included welcoming HRH The Princess Royal, HRH The Earl of Wessex and HRH Princess Alexandra.

In July I was invited to a dinner hosted by HRH The Prince of Wales at his Welsh home to promote the relationship between Hereford Cathedral and the Houston Museum of Natural Science in the United States. It has now been agreed that Hereford Cathedral's copy of the Magna Carta will be loaned to the museum for six months from early next year, which will be a wonderful way to promote tourism further in this beautiful county.
