Shropshire 2012-13

In October we were honoured by two more royal visits when HRH The Earl of Wessex officially opened the new Abraham Darby Academy building at Telford, and when HRH The Princess Royal opened new halls of residence at Harper Adams University College at Newport, the leading agricultural college which achieved full university status in December.

November brought several invitations to attend Remembrance Day events around the county. I attended the parade, church service and wreath laying in Shrewsbury, our county town, while my wife Chris represented me in our home town of Oswestry, and laid a shrieval wreath at its war memorial. To round off a very busy day, we met up later in the afternoon to travel to the other side of the county for the Telford & Wrekin Festival of Remembrance in

In March my Legal Service of Thanksgiving for the Queen's Peace and our Heritage was held in the parish church of St Oswald's in Oswestry, with a large congregation including many members of the statutory and voluntary

organisations of the county, and our family and friends who had supported us during the year. We were honoured by the presence of the Lord-Lieutenant and his wife, the Bishop of Lichfield, who gave the sermon, the Bishop of Ludlow, visiting High Sheriffs from surrounding counties, and senior members of the armed forces.

During the service the Lord-Lieutenant presented long-service certificates to magistrates. This was an appropriate introduction to the heart of the service when the Bishops of Lichfield and Ludlow led the Rededication, when judges and magistrates pledged to serve the county and its people faithfully in the year ahead.

I just had time to present two college students with their very well-deserved High Sheriff's Young Citizenship Awards, before my year ended after exactly 12 months to the day, when I handed over to my successor, Diana Flint, at her Declaration ceremony at Shrewsbury Castle.

I am grateful to my Under Sheriff, Peter Stewart, for his helpful assistance throughout the year, and to my Chaplain, the Revd David Cassidy for taking a significant part in my Legal Service despite illness early in the New Year. It has been a privilege and honour to serve as High Sheriff of Shropshire, but I could not have done it without the wonderful support and encouragement of my wife Chris. □
